### **DAMARISCOTTA**

The Town of Damariscotta is vibrant and charming with bookstores, quaint shops and boutiques, and restaurants & pubs aplenty.

**Barn Door Bakery at Sherman's Bookstore:** Charming cafe with outdoor seating.

**Rue 44:** Great cafe with the best coffee in the area, and great baked goods, and sandwiches.

**Sunnyside:** One of the few places in the area that serves breakfast.

**Newcastle Public House:** Great beer on tap and upscale pub food.

**Oxbow Brewery:** A must see for beer drinkers and nature-lovers, this Newcastle brewery in the woods is much respected and a necessary stop on the Maine Beer Tour.

**River House:** Great wood-fired cuisine on the Damariscotta River - a great bet for finer dining.

**Bread in the Bone:** Upscale Farm-to-Table from the owners of the well-regarded Contented Sole in New Harbor. Produce provided from our local organic Wanderwood Farm.

**Shuck Station:** Amazing oyster house, offering an education on local varieties. Eclectic and varied menu, never disappoints for relaxed fare.

**Simmons Seafood Market:** Great local seafood-monger.

**Damariscotta River Grill:** A decent upscale seafood spot. Sit at the bar upstairs when you can!

**Oysterhead Pizza:** Local woodfire pizza (they do takeout!). And as their name alludes, oysters too.

**Riverside Butcher:** Amazing local meats (and great beer, wine, dry goods and cheese!) Check out their weekly selection of smoked meats.

## **ROUND POND**

Round Pond is a near-perfect Maine cove village and only 15 minutes' drive from Otyokwa.

**Muscongus Bay Lobster:** Great outdoor lobster and seafood spot. Get there early or off times to avoid lines. BYOB (but they also have a dock bar). Don't miss!

**Community Shellfish:** Our neighbors in Bremen, with great oysters, mussels.

**30 Are Farm stand:** Very close to Otyokwa, with their

**King Ro Market:** Small local grocer, subs and lunch staples to-go.

**Granite Hall:** Old time general store, with great Maine-made selections, candy, and ice cream of course!

**The Anchor:** More upscale seafood and cocktails by the water.

**Round Pond Coffee:** Charming coffeehouse hang with wifi. And they have a wine bar in the evening!

And a bit further down the peninsula....

**Pemaquid Lighthouse:** Iconic Pemaquid Lighthouse is great for a walk, a picnic, or a simple relaxing bench sit for a while. And you can dine at the nearby Bradley Inn, a great destination restaurant.

## **WALDOBORO**

**Dayboat Cafe:** Amazing local cafe with sandwiches, prepared meals and dry goods. Say hi to Anna and Kelsey!

**Odd Alewives Brewery:** Atmospheric Brewpub and Beer Garden. Can't miss for beer-drinkers. Wood-fire pizza usually served, but often there's a rotating menu (tacos, Greek food, etc...)

**Perch Cafe:** café perfection – warm vibe, delightful baked goods, and breakfast options aplenty.

**Narrows Tavern:** Downtown watering hole. Legit Pub food with local charm.

**Ida's:** Wine, beer and (sometimes) cocktails in the funky and fun lounge bar at the back of the Waldorboro Inn.

**Moody's Diner:** Iconic Maine breakfast spot. Full Diner experience. Make sure you order some of their homemade doughnuts!

**Delano's Seafood Market and Lobster Shack:** Fantastic Seafood purveyor. What it lacks in coastal views, it makes up for in variety, prices, and availability. Fresh seafood aplenty, but also check out the frozen section – the lobster pie is killer.

## **SUGGESTED DAY TRIPS**

### **Damariscotta-Newcastle:**

Sunnyside Breakfast for your morning fill-up or Barn Door Café if you'd prefer in-and-out breakfast and coffee and maybe a browse through Sherman's Book Shop. Drive to the end of Glidden Street just across the bridge in Newcastle, have a nice walk by the river, stop in some of the many

great local shops on Main St Damariscotta, catch a new (or not so new...) movie or documentary at the Lincoln Theater, Reny's for a Maine Adventure, then Shuck Station or Oxbow for an afternoon beer.

### **Round Pond:**

Round Pond Coffee to kick off your morning, explore Pemaquid Point Lighthouse, come back and hit Shaw's or Muscongus Bay Lobster for lunch, and then ice cream at Granite Hall. Stop by Community Shellfish for some Cora Cressy oysters on your way home (you might need to go around the side if the store front isn't manned – don't be bashful!)

### **New Harbor/Pemaquid:**

Early hike at La Verna Preserve, Shaw's for lunch, perhaps a trip to Monhegan Island on the ferry (also worth a day trip itself, if not an overnight...). Experience the ocean views and climb along the rock formations at the iconic Pemaquid Lighthouse. Cocktail at Bradley Inn or The Anchor, dinner at Contented Sole.

### **Waldoboro:**

Perch Café for Breakfast, Beth's market for fresh produce, Morse's Sauerkraut for their amazing European Deli and gourmet foods and beverages, then Moody's or the Narrows for lunch, then a beer and a relaxing afternoon at Odd Alewives beautiful beer garden.

## **WORTH THE DRIVE**

Camden: Easily a day of exploring this Mid-Coast town.

Long Grain: Some of the best Asian food anywhere. Casual, but get a reservation in summer.

Chase's Daily in Belfast: Best farm to table in the Northeast.

## OTHER JAUNTS

**Hiking Guide:** There's a Camp Copy of 'On the Trail in Lincoln County' the definitive guide to hiking trails nearby, which details the unbelievable number of local hiking spots. Hidden Valley Nature Center is a sure bet, followed by a stop in at The Alna Store for lunch or dinner (or a post-hike beverage).

**National Audubon Society and Hog Island:** Famous birdwatching spot 10 minutes away with water access, great walking trails.

**La Verna Preserve:** Fantastic cliffside view of the ocean.
